They have put their scientific knowledge to the test and conducted a science investigation based on insulators and thermal conductors and which material would work best to keep my coffee cup warm! A very important investigation!











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### Alfoxton

This week in Alfoxton Class we have learned lots of new things, but our main news is that we have achieved six gold stars for superb behaviour, politeness, and attitude to learning. This means we have earned a treat! We held a class vote and decided we would like to celebrate our achievement by having a pyjama and film afternoon. Miss Day will send an email and letter home soon to confirm when this will take place.

In English, we have been preparing to write an information text about rivers. We have learned how to use a variety of conjunctions and about past, present and future tense verbs, so our writing will be superb as well as informative! Our English links nicely to our Geography learning as we are finding out about how rivers are formed. We have been thinking about the River Parrett which runs through Bridgwater. We found out that it is tidal, which means the water level rises and falls as the tide comes in and out.

In RE, we are beginning to learn about Mary, from the Christian stories. This week, we have learned about the different symbols used to represent her. We didn't realise there were so many symbols to represent her! We compared these symbols to those used in Hinduism too. We thought about the similarities and differences between how the religious deities and important people have been represented over time.

In Maths, we began a new unit of learning which is all about measure. We had a great time finding different objects around our classroom that are greater or smaller than one metre. We began by estimating and then moved on to measuring with accuracy.

At the very end of last week, the whole school participated in fundraising for Children in Need. We raised over £60 by coming to school in non-uniform which is fantastic! We took some photos of ourselves creating paper collage Pudsey Bear pictures. This linked to our Art learning as we first expressed opinions of the artwork created by Ed Fairburn and Robin Brooks, both of whom are collage artists. It was so much fun to explore the use of tissue paper to create a fun image to represent a good cause!











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### Triscombe

Our book this half term is Lost and found. We predicted what we thought the story would be about and were very surprised to found out what it really is about. In the story a boy found a penguin on his doorstep and we explored the different feelings he could have. We also thought of the questions we could ask with a focus on question marks.

The sunflower seeds we planted last half term have begun to grow (much to Miss M's surprise). Mrs Cross has been so kind to make sure they are watered and turned on a regular basis. We wonder whose will be the tallest!







#### **Preschool**

This week we have been looking at desert animals and their habitat. We explored our desert tough tray full of animals and desert plants such as cacti.

We used our fingers to make paint marks on desert pictures, counted camels and matched animal shadows to their corresponding animal. For phonics this week, we have been reading the book I say Ooh, you say ahh, which the children have really enjoyed. They have had to remember lots of instructions for different words during the story, which has encouraged lots of good listening, concentration and co-ordination!

We have also been learning another one of our Nativity songs 'Baby Jesus'.

How lovely it was to hear from Luca who borrowed a book from our school library and read it at home in two days! He came to school buzzing with excitement and ready to share his recommendations to read this book titled, 'The Sister Who Ate Her Brothers'.
