## **Alfoxton**

Last week was so exciting as our last Maths lesson of the week was taken over by an unexpected, but VERY welcome visitor - Mel, the Hermann tortoise! She belongs to Miss Millar, who kindly popped her into class to say hello! We all enjoyed cuddling her (as much as one can cuddle a tortoise), and learning about her diet and lifestyle. Take a look at our lovely photos of Mel as she joined us for Maths (we were, and are, learning about measuring in centimetres, metres and millimetres).

In Art, we have produced some lovely collages of the River Parrett. These are inspired by Robin Brooks' collages which are formed from thin layers of paper and tissue paper. We have learned how to overlap colours to make darker shades and produce new colours - it's quite different to mixing colour with paint! Photos of these will be available in next week's newsletter.

In English, we have written a leaflet informing people of the importance of water. We used an example text which explains how important plants and trees are, then we modified it to write our own leaflets. Next week, we will illustrate them so they are appealing to readers before we share them with Beacon and Triscombe Class. Our writing has been supported by the learning we have achieved in Geography: we have learned about the different parts of rivers and where some of the most famous rivers in Britain are. We thought we would create a collage of the River Parret as it is the closest river to us and so, the most relevant.

In Science, we have learned about friction. Our experiment this week was so fun: we rolled toy cars down ramps made of different materials to test how they affected the vehicle's speed - ask us what we found out! The scientific enquiry we used was 'fair testing'. To ensure we had tested fairly, we conducted the same experiment three times and took the average result as our final findings. We do love experimenting in Science! We can't wait until next week when we begin to explore the force of magnetism!

This week, Triscombe Class have been continuing to read the book Lost and Found. The children enjoyed taking part in some hot seating, pretending to be the boy in the story. The other children then had to ask questions to the boy about how he found a penguin.

Reception have been continuing numbers to 6 then making the number and writing it.



## **Preschool**

This week we have been learning about the Arctic and the different animals which live there. We have had two different tough trays to investigate, with two different textures of snow to explore. The first tray was full of different artic animals and our second tray was a maths activity where the children had to help the penguins find their homes by matching the numbered penguins to their corresponding numbered igloos. We have matched baby animals to their larger mothers and role played with Arctic animal masks. We have read 'Swim polar bear, swim', 'Egg to penguin' and 'What on earth? Life in the Tundra' to find out more about life in the Artic and we have practiced our pen control by marking a route from the penguin to his igloo and the polar bear to his glacier.

I have also included some photos of Mel, who we met last week whilst we were learning about the Desert. Ashley kindly brought in Mel, one of her tortoises for the children to meet!
