Beacon

Beacon class have had an excellent week of learning this week. The children have edited and improved their selkie tradition tales and I must say, I am very impressed with their writing and their imaginations. They used their imaginations to interpret a dream from the book this week with some wonderful results.

We are continuing to look at numbers to 10 million in maths and how this large number is made up. This will hopefully be useful for the children's futures, when they are all millionaires!

Alfoxton

This week in our Science lesson, we made everybody jealous by making chocolate rice crispy cakes! Anyone might think it was a cooking class, but no! We were learning about the melting points of different solids. We tried to melt chocolate using water at 10 Degrees Celsius, 40 Degrees Celsius, and 90 Degrees Celsius (with super supervision of course). We predicted that the chocolate would melt at 90oC and some of us thought it might even melt at 10oC. We found out that chocolate won't melt at all at 10 Degrees Celsius, will only melt the smallest amount around the edges at 40 Degrees Celsius but melts quickly at 90 Degrees Celsius.

Did you know that when a solid turns into a liquid, the particles, that are tightly bound together, begin to break and move around? Isn't it fascinating?

In English, we have written the draft copy of our own stories based on Arthur and the Sword in the Stone. We changed the characters and the weapon to make the stories unique! We have edited them and are now ready to write them in our neatest writing (so you can see them on parents' evening!).

In Maths, we are learning about the composition of numbers to 100. Did you know that 100 can be made of four 25s, or two 50s, or even 10 ten times!

Finally, in Art we have been designing some Anglo-Saxon pendants that we will be making in the next few weeks. Did you know that Anglo-Saxons used amethyst and garnet in their jewellery - it was very beautiful and the decorations were so intricate! (We've been learning that word - intricate).







Triscombe

It's been another busy week in Triscombe class. We have come to the end of our woodwork sessions and we have learned a lot like controlling a saw, being safe around tools and precision cutting. In Reception, we have started learning tricky words in phonics. In Geography, we discovered why there are seasons and what makes them change.









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Preschool

For the next two weeks of term, we are learning about Harvest Festival. We have looked at what happens during the harvest by watching a short video and have been looking at where some of our food produce comes from by watching cows being milked and wheat being ground into flour. We have been listening to the Harvest Samba and using musical instruments to create our own Harvest rhythm. We have been engaged in various Harvest themed activities; including fine motor control button, pen control and farm and food themed puzzles and have been using playdough to make our own representations of the food we eat.

It was amazing to learn about the artwork and local artists and to see all the mythical sea creatures around the church. Amongst them were aquatic creatures the children had created in school.
