### **Beacon**

Beacon Class have stepped into the role of detective this week: trying to discover the true events of the night Bess (from their English text, The Highwayman) was captured. Pupils spent time in-role as a witness and an interviewer, trying to uncover what happened that terrible night! This will all feed into their news report which will be planned and written next week, followed by some performance poetry of their own!

Play rehearsals are coming along nicely, with many children helping out with props and sound effects - it is going to be amazing and the children are learning a lot about collaborative working and performance.

Continuing with their work toward the Arch Bishop of York Award, Beacon class went on a walk around the village. This was to identify what problems there were in order to help and improve the community. Areas of concern to the children were the vandalism in the park, thorns and overgrown pathways and litter. Together Beacon class decided the action they would take, which included going on a litter pick, and writing to the Parish Council regarding the overgrown pathways and asking for a bin to be placed in one of the parks.

#### **Alfoxton**

Alfoxton class have been absolute troopers this week! Not only have they completed all of their assessments, they have done this on the hottest day of the year so far. Miss Mold is so proud of how focussed and hard they have worked this week. This afternoon we are learning about the River Parrett, and the children are producing an information poster to show everything they have learned.

### **Triscombe**

We have had another busy week in Triscombe Class! Year 1 have completed their phonics screening this week. The girls concentrated really well and we are all very proud of the effort they always put into their phonics sessions. We are learning about light and sound in science. We are fortunate that the weather has been so sunny, as this meant we could go outside to explore shadows. We had fun drawing around the shadows of people and objects. Next, we are going to explore drawing around shadows of the same things at different time of the day to find out how they change.

In English we have been rewriting our own versions of Little Red Riding Hood. The children have innovated the stories with their own characters, from Little Blue Puppy to the Big Bad Grizzly Bear. We are enjoying reading their lovely, creative stories.









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### **Little Acorns Pre-school**

With Daddy's Day this Sunday we have focused on 'My Family' – all those important people in our life. So, what makes Daddy or Grandad special? Triscombe completed their Adventurers module on water and landforms this week. Reception class used natural materials, sand and gravel to make water filters, comparing the efficiency of their filters with each other. Years 1 and 2 students learned about and applied a scientific method to complete experiments to better understand the impact of water on the erosion of a sand 'beach' and sand mound. They also had to design a barrier of natural materials and test it as a defence to protect their sand mound. It was a bit of a sandy, sticky end after all the experiments were complete!
