We also explored Valentine's day through playing with items in tough trays and matching hearts!



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
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#### **Adventurers**

This week, Alfoxton began the unit on Sikh cooking. We made vegetable pakoras. The children were shown how to slice an onion thinly by leaving the root on to hold it all together until the last minute. They all did an excellent job of doing this and chopping potatoes and cauliflower to go into the batter. We introduced them to using cumin seeds, turmeric and garam masala to add those traditional Indian spices. Over the next few weeks, we will be making other dishes and may be eating them at school but if you're lucky you may get a taster.

Mr Tucker was very impressed with the work ethic in Beacon class this week as they made a start on the longawaited birdhouses. Children carefully measured their pieces of wood, g-clamped them to the tables and got to work sawing with tenon saws and junior hacksaws. Most children managed to get it to a quality finish by filing and sanding. The pieces have now been sent off to Haygrove where Mr Featherstone and his team are using industrial drills to cut out the entrance holes. Next half term, we will be cutting the final pieces and assembling our final products based on our unique designs.
