

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


Preschool

Last week and this week, we have continued with our space theme. Last week saw the children making colourful cotton wool planets, using pipettes to drop paint onto the cotton wool pads. They made sun catchers by sticking coloured cellophane shapes onto rocket and planet shaped sticky back plastic and painted planets onto tin foil. We learned the planets names through song and measured out ingredients to make smoothie lollies.

This week the children have enjoyed making rocket models from junk modelling and enjoyed choosing which colours to paint them. They have used fine motor skills by picking up 'space rocks' with tweezers and spoons to transport them through 'space'. Using chalks, the children chose planets and drew circles to represent them, before copying the details of the planet's surfaces onto their drawings. They also got to try the smoothie lollies they made last week at snack time - which went down a treat!

This week our book has been 'Amazing' and we have talked about who we think is amazing - Mummy came out top of the list with most of the children, alongside a child's fish! We also used our 'Wishing star' to think about what we would wish for if we were an astronaut in space and how we would feel if our wish came true. The answers ranged from - having a wrap to eat, which would make them happy to taking a penguin, as they got one from Father
