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
Alfoxton

This week, we have been busy rehearsing all the songs for the school Nativity which will take place on December 18th at 6 pm in St Andrew's Church- we are very much looking forward to it.

In English, we finished our leaflets about water and began reading a wonderful book called 'The Rhythm of the Rain' by Grahame Baker-Smith. It made us think about how water is used over and over again as we followed the journey of a pool of water, transitioning through evaporation and condensation, falling as precipitation... over and over! It travelled the world until it finally returned to the pool of water it had started.

Also, we are going to try to squeeze in writing a short story (about Christmas of course), before we break up for the Christmas holidays!

In Maths, we have created lovely Christmassy bar graphs (using the knowledge we have learned in lessons). We had to think about the intervals on the Y axis and how to divide the X axis to create a well-presented graph. Before we inputted the information onto the graph, we created tally charts to record our data. We were displaying information about the most popular Christmas decorations! It was quite fun.



Triscombe

This half term, we have been learning about Antarctica and the animals that live there. We have enjoyed playing with the Antarctic small world. In Science we classified animals, first into invertebrates, animals with no back bone, and vertebrates, animals with a back bone. We then classified vertebrates into mammals, amphibians, reptiles, fish, birds and invertebrates into the insects classification. We were lucky to have a visit from a very friendly reptile called 'Mel' (Ashley's pet tortoise) we got a chance to touch his dry scaly skin and its hard shell.









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Preschool

We have had fun this week with lots of festive activities. We used white paint, scrapers, snowflakes, sequins, and small flakes of iridescent paper to make beautiful snowy creations. The children practiced their scissor skills, cutting out presents, baubles and stars to stick onto their Christmas trees. They used fine motor skills, to place buttons onto different lines; wavy, zigzag and spiral and then used tweezers to pick up pom poms to place them in their corresponding-coloured bowls. The children matched Christmas objects and characters together by finding their other half and then tested their memories when they turned all the cards over and then had to find the matching halves! They did brilliantly well at this game and took turns, waiting patiently until it was their go. We have explored the objects and smells of oranges and cinnamon in our tough tray and sprinkled the 'snow', watching it fall between our fingers! We also found out, if we blew into the tray, we could create a 'snowstorm'! The children have been listening to stories of the Nativity, and we have talked about Mary, Joseph, and baby Jesus and what Christmas means. We also joined up with Triscombe class again to practise our songs for our Nativity.
