
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Beacon

We have investigated deeper in to the work of Danny Osborne and methods of sculpting and created an in-depth study of the Alps and the Lake District. <u>Alfoxton</u>

This week we've explored the question, 'How does light travel?'. We know that light is energy from a light source and travels in straight lines. We wanted to check this so we made periscopes from cereal boxes and mirrors - they really worked! We discovered that because light travels in straight lines, it would hit both mirrors inside our periscopes and be reflected into our eyes. It was so much fun! We could hide under the table and spy on the other side of the classroom without anyone seeing us!

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Triscombe

The children have been working hard in Triscombe class this week. They have learned and performed a dinosaur poem. As well as recognising syllables. This has been supported by their brilliant phonics knowledge. We have been very impressed with their English skills this week.

Year 2 have been working very hard in Maths and we are so proud of them.

During foundation lessons this week, the children have created brilliant painting of the precious things in the world linking to Psalm. They put their primary colours to create secondary colours and dinosaur footprints. In Science, they used their data from last week's mini-beast hunt and made a chart.

The class are really enjoying our dinosaur and fossils topic. They have been very creative during provision putting their skills to the test.



Preschool

This week, we have continued our learning about Winter weather. The children have used different media to create snowflakes, for example paint, brushes and tin foil, cotton buds, paint and paper, lollypop sticks, paint and glitter and chalk pens on chalkboards. They have mixed cornflour and shaving foam to make their own 'snow', adding googly eyes and pipe cleaners to create snowmen. The children used lollipop sticks to make their own hanging snowflakes and decorated them with paint and glitter. We have also talked about different ways to keep warm in the cold Winter weather by wearing coats, hats and gloves and drinking hot chocolate to keep warm!
