Beacon Class

This week, our Year 6 pupils have demonstrated great resilience and shown how hard they can work during the KS2 SATs. "We've had to work really hard but it is definitely worth it because we got extra play and the teachers have been really supportive," explained Georgina.

Whilst the Year 6s have been busy working away, the rest of the class have been continuing their learning journey with Mrs Payne and are thoroughly enjoying their class reading book, 'Street Child," which is about a Victorian boy called Jim who loses his family and finds himself in the workhouse. <u>Alfoxton</u>

In English, Alfoxton class are looking at what technical vocabulary is, how to recognise and use it in an explanation text. We have been finding out how to make a whole number in Maths and we are now finding out about fractions which are greater than 1 using the terms 'mixed number' and 'improper fractions.' We wrote about the changes in a river as it goes from source to mouth for Geography this week. We learnt that there are three stages to a river, young, middle aged and old. Each of these stages contain specific features and have a different water velocity. Circuits and how they work is this week's science where we will be creating circuits for a torch and a doorbell. This will involve trial and error as we discover how to build these circuits. Using the correct circuit symbols, we will also be drawing them into our books. "It was really fun seeing my circuit work and everyone in our group was really proud," beamed Harry B.

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It's parables this week in RE, where the children explored, 'The sower and the seeds.' The class wrote what they thought Jesus was trying to teach using this parable. We then looked at what other people thought and formed an opinion with more clarity.





Triscombe

Our Animals topic continues this week with a new book called, 'Surprising Sharks.' So far, we have learned that there are lots of different types of sharks with many different names such as Hammerhead, Nurse and Angel Shark. We have been exploring the celebration of Hanukkah and Judaism in RE and in English, we have been finishing off our work on the Storm Whale. We have been innovating our own stories using the Storm Whale as a guide, creating different sea creatures and character names within a storm setting. Our Year 2s have been encouraged to use lots of fun adjectives, such as; raging storm, crashing waves, swirling seas. In Maths, Reception have been their subitising skills to instantly recognising how many objects there are, without needing to count, and using arrays where this is helpful. Year 1s have been counting up to 100 in 2s, forwards and backwards. Year 2s are starting to look at fractions and what makes a half. What a busy week in Triscombe class!
