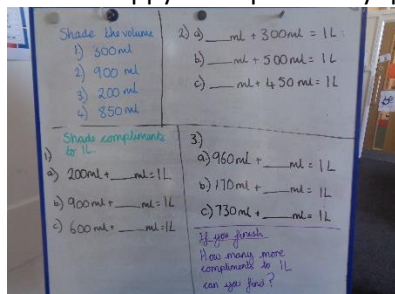

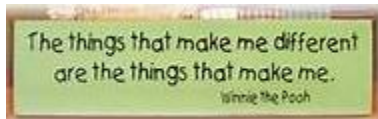
In Maths Y1 and Y2 are both working on fractions, and continuing to practice telling the time. Reception have been learning number bonds to ten.
