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#### Triscombe

This week Triscombe have learned all about the story of the Nativity and have been practising songs ready for the nativity. In Mastering Number, Reception have been using their subitising skills (seeing quantity without counting) and representing quantities in different ways, whilst Year 1s have been partitioning numbers 1-5 in different ways, Year 2s have been adding 2-digit numbers across 10. This has continued into their play where the children have enjoyed counting the animals and using the large scales to work out which objects weighed more than or less than a number. Triscombe have also been looking at hibernation and have all enjoyed drawing pictures of a dormouse.



## Pre-school

This week the children have been following the story of Stick-Man. They have taken part in lots of cutting and sticking activities to help improve dexterity, and really enjoyed recreating the Stick-Man story with the cut and stick storyboards. They have also enjoyed lots of time on the bikes and trikes and creating chalk art on the 'big playground'. They also had another visit from Rev Alison who continued to read the Nativity story with them, the children listened really well and asked some really great questions.

#### **Adventurers**

Beacon have been making cakes for the past few weeks using different methods. Last week they made carrot cakes using the all-in-one method. They really did not like the thought of putting cream cheese on top of the cakes but once they had mixed it with icing sugar and tasted the finished cakes with the cream topping, they realised just how nice they were. This week they used the all in one method to make courgette cakes. They were definitely not keen on this idea. However, once the spices were added and they had tasted the finished cakes they again realised that they weren't as bad as they thought they would be.
