This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

- Our Music Curriculum is set out on the school website with the long term plan and the small steps documents
- It is informed by the model music curriculum (March 2021) as we follow the Oak National Academy scheme.
- We partner with the Somerset Music Service and join in with local singing festivals.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

- Violin and guitar tuition is available but is paid for by parents and arranged between them and the Music Service.
- Key Stage 2 Choir is offered on occasions throughout a typical year and attend local singing festivals.
- Pupils can rehearse or practice individually or in groups with Miss Day who usually leads this.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

- We hold a Nativity at Christmas at Church in which singing heavily features
- We hold a Harvest Festival and Easter Service at Church
- The whole school participates in the Summer Production led by Year 5/6 and this is held at the Victory Hall.
- We complete the year with the leavers' service at church in which singing is a big feature.
- Being a Church school, we sing hymns and aim to achieve a mix of traditional and modern music to build cultural capital and hymns are chosen to reflect the purpose of the activities being carried out.
- All events are free to take part in with no charge.

In the future
