TOYS

ATTENDANCE

Obviously, now we are getting back to normal, attendance monitoring will continue with the help of our Attendance Officer Elaine Detain.

We noticed last year children arriving late to school after registers had closed. This automatically results in an unauthorised absence, even if your child is here! You can do your bit by making sure your child is not late to school and gets here on time before 9am, preferably.

Please don't be afraid to ask for help if your child is finding it difficult to get back into the routine of school.



PE DAYS

A measure we have continued from the pandemic is that children may come to school in a tracksuit on PE days. These days are outlined below:

All classes - Fridays Triscombe + Year 3 - Tuesdays

COVID RISK ASSESSMENT

In short, here are our risk assessment measures:

General Operations

- School site opens at 8.45am. No children should be on the site prior to this time as there is no one to supervise.
- Triscombe enter the classroom at 8.45am, Alfoxton and Beacon wait in the area by the side gate. These two classes enter at 8.55am.

- Distancing etc will no longer be required, as well as mask-wearing.
- Pre-school arrangements remain unchanged.
- Gates will open at 3.20pm each day and all three classes will be brought out at the side gate area.

Prevention of Transmission Measures Remaining

- Classrooms will continue to be well-ventilated and aired out after each session.
- Regular stops for handwashing.
- Staff and children may home test twice a week.
- Regular review of our risk assessment.
- Enhanced cleaning of frequently-touched surfaces daily.

We have a COVID19 outbreak plan to reinstate measures if that is what Public Health England requires us to do and if we meet certain thresholds of cases:

- 3 members of staff in close contact contracting COVID19.
- 5 children in close contact contracting COVID19.

In the event of positive cases, self-isolation for 10 days is required and a switch to remote learning (if applicable). This would have to be confirmed following a follow-up PCR test.

Close contacts are not required to self-isolate if:

- o Double-jabbed
- o Under 18

Contact Tracing responsibilities have now been taken away from school but if you have information on cases, please do share with Mr Tucker directly.

KILVE RESIDENTIAL- YEAR 5/6

This is happening Monday 28th February - Weds 2nd March 2022. A letter will go out about this exciting residential for Year 5/6 and we hope this gives ample time for payment. Please speak to Miss Day or Mrs Pear for further details. If you would struggle with payment, please talk to Mr Tucker as we have contingency for discounts for those families eligible.

HOME-SCHOOL AGREEMENTS

There are still a number of home-school agreements outstanding. Mrs Pear has sent a new copy to those who have not returned theirs. Please can you return these signed to the office or alternatively you can consent to this via the Arbor App we have recently launched. Please can these be signed and returned by 30th September.

HAPPINESS CLUBS/ TUTORING

Tutoring will be starting up very shortly and parents will be approached about this. Sessions start at 3pm and last until 4pm. Your child is then automatically entitled to a free place in After School Club and they will get dinner. This is for the day they are doing the tutoring.

Allfoxton - Theme around poverty since 1066, covering Medieval, Tudor, Stuart, Georgian and Victorian History.
