Alfoxton

Our summer topic is Water. We are starting our water journey by looking at rivers. This week, we are learning about features of a river. There are lots of features and we are looking forward to finding out what a 'source' is and what the 'journey of a river' is like and how it links to our local area. In Science, we have started learning about electricity. This week we found items that use mains electricity, batteries and both. There was a lot of discussion about which items were mains only and which might use both.

In spelling, we are focusing on 15 words over the next two weeks. These were sent home to parents with hints and tips to help your child. In Maths we are continuing to learn about perimeter. The children need to be able to convert measurements: mm to cm, cm to mm, cm to m, m to cm. Your support at home is appreciated. Year 3 are learning their 4 times tables. Year 4 are learning their 3 times tables and practising for the National Times Tables Test. 
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Triscombe

This week in science, Triscombe have been exploring the classification of animals: looking at what they eat, whether they are herbivores, carnivores or omnivores. The children matched food items to the animal. Jack excelled at knowing which animal ate which items, "Seagulls eat other animals - they might eat baby birds and fish." The children have been enjoying reading a new class book, 'The Storm Whale,' and have even been acting out some of the pages of the book including how the main character Noi is feeling.
