A scientific focus in Triscombe's learning over the past week, with some practical investigations... Where seeds come from were explored and children investigated a range of fruit, including mango, passion fruit, tomato, cashew, watermelon and pomegranate. We talked about how some fruit contains seeds that we eat, such as passion fruit, pomegranate and tomato. This was followed by going outside and planting some seeds. We have also been exploring materials, finding out which materials can be twisted, bent, stretched and squashed and discussing which properties make each material good for certain uses.
